The TwoWings Foundation is a non-profit organization based in Austria that works for empowerment and sustainable solutions in materially disadvantaged communities around the world. TwoWings was founded in 1996 for development programs based on the Austrian Association Act with the guiding principle of "Releasing Human Potential" through education. At TwoWings, we believe in the importance of partnership and collaboration with local communities and NGOs to collectively promote effective development tailored to their specific needs and resources. Our approach is characterized by effective consultation and mutual respect, avoiding preconceived solutions and instead finding flexible concepts and solutions that can adapt to the changing needs of the community.

TwoWings has a North-South Advisory Board, which is made up of four members each from the Northern Hemisphere and four members from the Southern Hemisphere. This body decides on the allocation of funds for development projects in order to ensure that the interests of both the representatives of the North and the South are taken into account. TwoWings strives to promote partnership and balanced coexistence between North and South.

TwoWings also ensures that the projects are selected according to local needs, are well designed and are supported by the population. The Board of Trustees, which includes university professors, experts and honorary members, is committed to the TwoWings idea and works to make the world a better place.

Sustainability

When selecting a project, the focus is on the sustainability of the project and its impact on those involved and the affected population group. Development processes and not just temporary solutions are initiated.


The secret of our success

Current programs supported by the TwoWings Foundation

FUNDAEC, Colombia: Education and agroforestry for a better life

Training program supports the rural population of Colombia with targeted teaching units. Colombia is characterized by a high rate of crime and violence as well as extreme poverty, rural exodus and lack of access to education. The development of appropriate training programs encountered great difficulties. In 1974, professors and students at the University of Del Valle in Cali, Colombia, started a field experiment and tested a new way of imparting knowledge with a group of about 20 young people. This initiative led to the creation of the NGO FUNDAEC.

TwoWings supports FUNDAEC in improving access to education in rural areas by developing teaching materials and training teachers to provide quality education to children in remote rural communities. As part of their community development program, they support communities in developing sustainable solutions to social and economic challenges. The focus is on promoting self-sufficiency and empowering communities to take their development into their own hands.

Empowering communities through sustainable development

FUNDAEC is an organization that combines traditional knowledge with modern science to conduct research, educate people and promote projects in various fields. It works with farmers and families to develop sustainable agricultural systems. FUNDAEC's decentralized education system aims to empower individuals and improve community life. The curriculum is divided into three levels, and the network counts around 40,000 students who build local projects. FUNDAEC has three branches, including a school system, a university, and agricultural production facilities. It was praised as one of the "best educational projects" and was a worldwide project of EXPO 2000. TwoWings is non-partisan and non-denominational. The funded projects are open to people of all races, ethnicities and religions, without restrictions.

Preparation for Social Action: Vanuatu, Südpazifik.

Preparation for Social Action (PSA) is a training program of the NGO "Foundation for the Betterment of Society" (FBS) for young people in remote regions of Vanuatu. Young people and participants are trained and accompanied to become promoters of the common good. The TwoWings Foundation supports this project to help communities in Vanuatu build resilient, sustainable and self-sufficient villages while preserving their cultural heritage and natural resources. The project focuses on promoting education, sustainable agriculture and clean energy initiatives in rural areas of Vanuatu.

APRODEPIT: Chad, Africa

According to a United Nations report, the Republic of Chad ranks eleventh among the least developed countries in the world. On average, the population has to live on less than USD 3 per day, and 73% of the population has no access to clean drinking water. The adult literacy rate is 53% for men and only 36% for women. However, there is hope for the project.

APRODEPIT, the Association for the Promotion and Development of Pisciculture, was a recognized non-governmental organization based in Sarh, a city on the Chari River in the south of the country. Its main goal was to improve living conditions through education.

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Rays of Light: Development in Papua New Guinea and the Solomon Islands

Education for the progress and well-being of the community

Rays of Light is a program that provides support to underprivileged girls and young women in Papua New Guinea and the Solomon Islands. The aim of the program is to promote education and empower young women to take on a leadership role in their communities. Activities and services of the Rays of Light program include educational support, leadership training, life skills training, and community engagement events. The Preparation for Social Action (PSA) program is an academically rigorous and morally empowering curriculum developed by FUNDAEC, a Colombian development organization, to address the challenges faced by young people who do not have access to other forms of secondary education in rural areas in Papua New Guinea and the Solomon Islands.

The programme is open to both those who are already pursuing higher education in another context and those who do not have access to another form of secondary education if their main motive for participation is the desire to become an effective agent of change. The programme has been successfully implemented not only in Papua New Guinea and the Solomon Islands, but also in Zambia, Kenya, Uganda and Cameroon.



Financial education seminar for women

TwoWings Foundation and Partner Bank cooperate for a successful workshop

In September 2022, the TwoWings Foundation, in collaboration with Partner Bank, hosted a financial education workshop for women in Vienna. The aim of the workshop was to provide women with financial knowledge and skills to empower them to make informed decisions for their financial well-being. The workshop covered a range of topics such as investing for women, preparing for life situations, safe investments and high-risk investments.

We are proud that more than 20 women took part in the workshop at Partner Bank's premises in Vienna's city centre. The initiative to provide financial education for women in Austria was a great success, as the workshops took place in Linz and Himberg. As part of our commitment to women's empowerment, all participation fees were donated to the TwoWings Foundation.
